Spring is officially here but as usual the weather is hit or miss. We were able to open nine holes in mid March for four days but six inches of snow put an end to that. We reopened the entire course on the 31<sup>st</sup> which is still a week earlier than average. I would expect to still have frosty mornings so please check with the clubhouse before heading out to golf.

The course made it through the winter with minimal damage. We had some superficial snow mold on some tee and green banks but other than that it is pretty clean. We did not experience many heavy, wet snowfalls that tend to break tree branches this past winter. This made our course clean up a little easier than some of the past couple years.

In the beginning of the season it is very important to make sure that divots are filled and ball marks are repaired. With the grass not growing very fast it will

take much longer for these to heal. Cart traffic can also cause much more damage this time of year. If you see an area that is becoming worn from cart traffic please avoid it so that it has a chance to recover. Please keep all four tires on cart paths whenever possible. The beginning of the season is always an exciting time of year for both golfers and the maintenance staff. We get out of the shop and start to shake off the "cabin fever" we've dealt with the past couple months. I am looking forward to a beautiful summer of average temperatures and timely rainfall.
